

Exercise For This Video

Make your own color wheel. Use Oils, Acrylics, Pastels or Watercolor. With Watercolor avoid using too much water. Use it similar to Acrylics.

Note the temperature of colors, example two reds.

When making your color wheel use Cad red, Cobalt blue and Cad yellow for your primaries.

Proceed to make;

Secondary; Orange, Violet and Green mix equal parts

Fill in the space in between, for example, In-between the Yellow and Green, Yellow/Green and so on. This is called Tertiary Color

Notice color stays pure, bright and clear.

Complimentary; Directly across for the color wheel ex; Blue/orange paint side by side and mix equal parts Notice the type of grey produced mixing the different complementaries.

Continue experimenting with different temperature colors to see how color interacts For example, A Green/Blue Versus a Red/Blue mixed with Warm and cool reds.

This exercise helps acquaint you with some of the different properties of color such as Brightness or Saturation, and Temperature.
